13 I. PURPOSE

14 To state the policy of Louisiana State University and Agricultural and Mechanical College on the use of facilities and premises within its care and custody. 15

16 II. POLICY

- 17 Facilities and premises include buildings and property belonging to or in the care and custody of
- the Board of Supervisors of Louisiana State University. These facilities and premises are 18
- 19 established and reserved for use in accomplishing the instructional, research and public service
- 20 missions of LSU Eunice which must always be given first priority in the assignment of facilities
- 21 and premises for use. Accordingly, scheduling of facilities and premises use should not pre-
- 22 empt the use of facilities required for teaching, research and other academic activities.
- 23 LSU Eunice departments and divisions, recognized student organizations, affiliated
- 24 organizations as defined by the Bylaws & Regulations of the LSU Board of Supervisors, or
- 25 groups and organizations not otherwise affiliated with LSU may be granted permission to use its
- designated facilities and premises when such use does not interfere with the accomplishment of 26
- 27 campus missions and programs, either specific or general, and is in accordance with
- 28 established conditions which govern such use.
- 29 It is contrary to this policy for decisions regarding the use of designated LSU Eunice facilities
- 30 and premises to deny the exercise of constitutionally protected rights, to discriminate unlawfully,
- 31 or to knowingly result in unfair competition with private businesses; however, in all cases in
- which its facilities and premises may be used, LSU Eunice reserves the right to apply or 32
- 33 formulate reasonable conditions as to the time, place and manner in which such use may take
- 34 place.

35 **III. PRIORITY IN FACILITY USE**

- 36 Priority in the use of facilities and premises is established as follows:
- 37 A. LSU Eunice departments and divisions in the conduct of assigned missions and 38 programs.
- 39 B. Recognized student organizations, organizations of faculty and staff, and University

40 affiliated organizations for programs and activities conducted pursuant to the purposes41 of these organizations.

42 IV. PROGRAMMING DEPARTMENTS

43 Certain LSU Eunice departments and other components are specifically charged with the 44 development and presentation of educational, cultural, recreational, athletic and other programs 45 for the benefit of students, employees and the general public within facilities and premises 46 assigned to or available to those programming units. Examples of such programming units 47 include the Office of Continuing Education, the Office of Student Activities, the Office of Student 48 Affairs, the Athletic Department, and such others as may be designated by the Chancellor. Such 49 programming departments may sponsor programs on their own initiative as a departmental 50 activity or by written agreement with third party program providers through the Vice Chancellor 51 of Business Affairs. LSU Eunice administrative units or recognized student or campus 52 organizations may also sponsor programs within facilities and premises assigned to 53 programming departments.

- 54 A. Athletic Facilities
- 55 Athletic facilities including intercollegiate sports, recreational, and leisure sports are subject 56 to the following special provisions:
- Use of athletic facilities may be permitted by non-LSU Eunice groups for athletic
 events only with the sponsorship of an LSU Eunice administrative unit or recognized
 student or campus organization as provided for above. The Athletic Department may
 serve as a sponsor.

 2. In considering requests that would involve the use of athletic facilities by professional teams, applicable policies of the appropriate regulatory body shall be followed.
- 63 B. Incidental Use of Facilities and Premises

64 Although, LSU Eunice has no intent to knowingly permit the use of its facilities and premises so as to engage in unfair competition with private businesses, this policy recognizes that for 65 66 certain kinds of activities and programs, the size, location and specialized nature of some 67 LSU Eunice facilities may make them the most suitable available facilities for use by individuals and groups not otherwise associated with LSU Eunice. Under such 68 69 circumstances and with the requirement that such use may not interfere with or hamper the 70 conducting of LSU Eunice programs and activities, such incidental use may be approved by written agreement executed through the Vice Chancellor of Business Affairs. 71

72 C. Contracted University Services

In obtaining and providing for a variety of services necessary to the conduct of its missions
 and programs as well as for the benefit of employees and students, LSU Eunice may permit
 the use of its facilities and premises by third parties as a condition of written agreements
 executed through the Vice Chancellor of Business Affairs. Examples include rental of space,
 distribution of printed materials and other activities.

78 D. Fund Raising for Charitable Purposes

79 With the sponsorship of an LSU Eunice administrative unit or a recognized organization of students or employees, or an affiliated organization, LSU Eunice facilities and premises may 80 be used by a tax-exempt, charitable organization for the purpose of raising funds for 81 82 charitable purposes. In all such cases, the charitable organization must conduct the activity 83 itself with active and meaningful LSU Eunice sponsor involvement and may not contract with 84 a third party for the conduct of the fund raising event nor may the event be conducted in 85 such a way as to provide private businesses with opportunities to engage in commercial solicitation within LSU Eunice facilities and premises. Normally, such events are limited to 86 87 one for each organization during each year and federal tax-exempt status is required.

- 88 E. Relationship with Non-LSU Eunice Entities
- In granting use of its premises and facilities to non-LSU Eunice entities, LSU Eunice
 establishes certain conditions necessary to define its relationship with the entity using its
 facilities.
- 92 1. No agency or joint venture relationship may exist.

 2. Written indemnification against damages arising from or in the course of facility users use of its facilities and premises is required. LSU Eunice reserves the right to require certification as proof of insurance.
- In the absence of specific written agreement to the contrary, no license or other
 approval is granted for the use of the LSU Eunice name or any other word or images
 associated with LSU Eunice for purposes of direct or indirect endorsement or for any
 use other than to incidentally denote the location of an activity on its premises.
- In the absence of specific written authorization to the contrary, approval for the use
 In the absence of specific written authorization to the contrary, approval for the use
 of LSU Eunice facilities and premises grants no right for users of its premises and
 facilities to enter into third party agreements which may involve the use of its facilities
 and premises.
- 104 5. Educational, religious, and non-commercial organizations not affiliated with LSU 105 Eunice may be granted permission to use its facilities and premises to conduct 106 educational, informational, cultural, or religious programs for the benefit of their 107 members or the LSU Eunice community and the general public. Programs of these 108 organizations for the LSU Eunice community and the general public must be 109 sponsored by an LSU Eunice administrative unit or a recognized student or campus 110 organization with a logical relationship to the sponsored program and which must have an active and meaningful involvement with the management of the program. 111 112 For programs which are educational in nature and offered to the LSU Eunice 113 community and/or general public, LSU Eunice sponsorship must be by an LSU 114 Eunice academic unit or by the Office of Continuing Education. If an admission fee is charged to such events, it must be on a ticketed or "pay-at-the-door" basis only. If 115 funds are to be solicited otherwise, the program will be considered under provisions 116 117 relating to charitable fund raising.

118 V. FACILITY USE FEES

119 Use of LSU Eunice facilities is granted with the requirement that such use be at no direct cost to 120 LSU Eunice. Accordingly, reimbursement for services provided and other costs incurred may be

- required as a condition of using LSU Eunice facilities and premises. In addition, if the facility to be used is one in which all or a portion of its operating costs are derived from use charges, the normal use charges shall be applied. If an admission charge is collected or funds are solicited,
- 124 an additional fee may be assessed.

125 VI. ADMINISTRATION

- 126 Authority for decisions regarding the use of LSU Eunice facilities and premises under this policy
- 127 is vested in the Chancellor; however, review and action on routine requests by students and
- 128 student organizations is assigned to the Office of Student Affairs and the Vice Chancellor of
- 129 Business Affairs and for uses by non-students to the Vice Chancellor of Business Affairs.
