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### SUBJECT: Endowed Professorship Guidelines

According to the philosophy statement that appears in the LSU Eunice catalog, "the University strives to provide educational programs and related services which reflect and respond to the diversified interests, aptitudes, talents, needs, and goals of its constituency." LSU Eunice seeks to meet these educational and cultural needs by attracting and maintaining an

5 outstanding faculty that will provide a quality educational experience for all students.

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The endowed professorship program is a major effort by the university, the community, the LSU
 Board of Supervisors, and the Louisiana Board of Regents to demonstrate commitment to

9 quality of instruction by recognizing and fostering faculty excellence in professional

10 projects/research that goes beyond instructional responsibilities. Money has been donated by

11 community sponsors, the United States District Court, and the Board of Regents for these

12 awards.<sup>1</sup> The distribution of these awards will follow the guidelines set forth by the Board of

13 Regents, the LSUE Foundation, and by the current policy statement.

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15 By September 30<sup>th</sup> of each year, the chair of the Selection Committee for Endowed

16 Professorships will distribute a memorandum to the faculty regarding endowed professorships.

17 This memorandum should include information explaining the professorships and identifying the

awards to be granted, the amount of each award for that particular year, and the application

- process. The amount of each award will be based on interest generated by the funds, as well as
- 20 fund performance.21

### **Eligibility**

To be eligible to apply for an endowed professorship, a faculty member must meet the following
criteria:

- 1. Hold faculty rank at LSU Eunice.
- 2. Be employed on a full-time basis.
- 3. Hold permanent position at LSU Eunice.
- 30 Division/unit heads, full-time directors, and executive administrators are not eligible.

## Application Process

- Two Lafayette General Medical Center Endowed Professorships, awarded for nursing and allied health sciences;
- The Opelousas General Hospital Endowed Professorship, awarded for science in support of nursing (and other medical fields);
- The Fritz Lang Endowed Professorship, awarded for science in support of agriculture;
- The BellSouth, Atmos Energy, CenturyTel, CLECO, Entergy Louisiana Endowed Professorship, awarded for public policy.
- Two Train Derailment Endowed Professorships from the United States District Court, Western District of Louisiana, Lafayette-Opelousas Division, awarded in any discipline.

If a 95 suitable application is not selected for a professorship that was vacant the previous year, the 96 Selection Committee will reopen the application process with applications due March 21<sup>st</sup> and 97 review completed by April 28<sup>th</sup>. 98 99 Duration, Distribution, and Conditions of Awards 100 A. Each endowed professorship will be awarded for a period of one year. B. Recipients may re-apply in subsequent years. 101 102 C. A recipient will not be granted two concurrent endowments. 103 D. The award will become effective the following fiscal year, beginning July 1 and ending June 104 30. E. The award may be used for salary supplements and for expenses directly related to the 105 recipient's project. Order supplies and equipment outlined in the project budget prior to 106 107 submitting the interim report. 108 F. The university reserves the right to terminate the award if: 109 110 1. the recipient retires, resigns, or otherwise ends full-time employment status. 111 2. the recipient fails to use the funds as described in the recipient's proposal, as 112 determined by evaluation of the interim report (as noted below) by the Academic Unit 113 Head and Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs. 114 115 Any funds not spent at the end of the fiscal year will be reinvested in the professorship 116 account. 117

118 G. Recipients of endowed professorships will submit an interim report (mid-point in project

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119 completion) delineating progress in meeting goals, timelines, and project deliverables. The 120 interim report must contain a financial progress report. Recipients are required to submit a 121 final report summarizing sponsored activities and evaluating the effectiveness of the 122 endowed professorship program in supporting excellence in instruction, scholarly/research activity, and community/university service. Receipt of salary supplement (if salary 123 124 supplement is included in project budget) will be contingent on making satisfactory progress 125 in meeting project goals and objectives. The interim and final reports will be submitted to 126 the Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs, who will distribute copies to the head of the 127 academic division from which the endowment was granted and to the grantor (LSUE 128 Foundation) of the funds.

- H. The selection committee chair will forward all funded application proposals to the library after
   completion of the selection process. These proposals will be maintained on file in the library
   for review by interested parties.
- Each applicant selected to receive an Endowed Professorship must attend a training session that will be conducted annually in May.
- Any variation in the use of funds from the original budget must be pre-approved by the Vice
- 135 Chancellor for Academic Affairs. Requisitions to spend award funds must be reviewed by the
- 136 Director of Grants and Development to ensure compliance with the project budget.
