I. Approval of the March 27, 2025 Meeting Minutes

Ms. Jamie Funk motioned and Mr. Gary Reeves seconded; adopted with no dissent.

II. and III. Welcome and Publishing the Agenda and Meeting Minutes to the Strategic Planning Website

The committee welcomed Cassie Jobe-Ganucheau and discussed the preference for publishing meeting minutes to the website. The team decided to publish the agenda and meeting minutes approximately once a month.

IV. Continue editing a. vision; b. mission; and c. values.

The committee spent most of the time discussing the following related to the values:

- focus on open admission rather than specific terms,
- add a statement under each major value,
- mention distance learning, online programs, and affordability,
- terms such as transfer pathways, workforce pathways, and higher education partnerships under the collaboration category,
- terms such as credit for prior learning, ADA compliance, and Office of Disability Services,
- stewardship of public and private funds and a return on investment,
- accredited programs,
- the need for academic integrity and the quest for knowledge along with an emphasis on undergraduate research and technology,
- the concept of digital literacy and its relevance to student success,
- the importance of health and wellness,
- wrap around student services, and
- develop empathy.

The current list of values appears below.

Mission and Vision

The committee discussed refining the institution's mission and vision statements, focusing on incorporating concepts of excellence and responsiveness. They debated the placement and wording of key terms, and considered how to make the statements more inclusive of all aspects of the institution beyond just academics. The committee agreed to leave some proposed changes for further review with the Chancellor present. They concluded the meeting, acknowledging the challenging nature of the task and agreeing to continue the discussion at a later time.

Next Steps

- The Committee members are to
 - a. review and refine the draft values statements.
 - b. consider how to incorporate "excellence" into the vision or values statements.
 - c. review the vision statement and consider whether to remove "academic" and "workforce development" to make it broader.
 - d. consider how to incorporate "student-centered" into the values or introductory statements.
 - e. review the remaining items from the 2020 values list for potential inclusion in the new values statements.
- 2. Create a document in the shared folder for committee members to add brainstorming ideas and suggestions for the values statements.
- 3. Update the meeting minutes and post them on the website for campus-wide access.
